The school provides education for boys and girls aged between 7 and seventeen years who have social, emotional and behavioural problems. There is also a separate ASC unit called The Arc with specialist staff who support pupils who are on the spectrum.

The school provides a safe, educational and nurturing environment which meets the needs of all the students through bespoke, personalised curriculums.

Leaways School is rated "Outstanding" by Ofsted and provides specialist day placements for young people whose needs have not been met elsewhere.

Therapeutic support

The school offers a therapeutic approach to engaging young people in education and supporting them to achieve the skills and qualifications to move on. The diverse and creative staff team work in partnership with families, pupils, professionals and one another to meet the needs of each student. The staff team includes an occupational therapist, speech and language therapist and a therapeutic art therapist. The school is able to offer discreet interventions for those who require distinct learning strategies, including family and student support away from a school environment through outreach work. Cognitive Behaviour Therapy is being introduced for students who may benefit from this type of therapeutic input.



The therapeutic team consists of:

- Occupational Therapist
- Occupational Therapy Assistant
- Speech and Language Therapists
- Art and Drama Therapeutic Facilitator
- Cognitive Behaviour Therapist
- Mental Health Lead

The therapeutic team works together with the teaching, pastoral and support staff to ensure that each young person has the right support in place to deliver care and education together as a wraparound approach.

Securing Education and School SES (Outreach)

The staff at Leaways understand that all of the students have had difficult experiences of education or school. Securing Education and School (SES) is Leaways programme developed specifically to support and re-engage the most challenging young people back in to full time education.

SES offers outreach mentoring for students struggling to engage, by matching them with a key worker who delivers sessions consisting of mentoring, project work and core subject lessons. This allows pupils to have a staged integration, supported by the therapeutic team, back in to school.

Following on from the SES programme the school implements its readiness for learning group and there are plenty of trips and visits which help embed learning. The school follows national curriculum guidelines which are enhanced through project based learning, offsite opportunities and partnership working with other colleges and facilities.

By the time a young person leaves Leaways School they will have gained a range of meaningful qualifications, had a positive schooling experience, completed a work experience placement where appropriate, and gained the self-confidence and skills to be independent adults.

The Autism Resource Centre (ARC)

Leaways School hosts a specialist schooling provision for pupils who are on the autistic spectrum. The specialist ASC friendly provision has its own entrance and the environment is calm. The ASC provision offers smaller classroom sizes, sensory friendly changeable lighting and soundproofed walls in order to enhance the low arousal environment in which students can learn.

Facilities include:

- Large hall for dining, assemblies, drama and social time.
- Separate sound proofed classrooms for maths, English, humanities and PHSE.
- Access to the main school facilities such as food technology, design and technology and physical education for students who feel able to learn outside the ASC provision.

The specialist team within the ASC provision organise a residential trip each year to promote life skills and independence. For the majority of students this is the first time they have spent time away from home.





The School Environment

The school has been adapted to ensure it offers low arousal, minimum distraction learning spaces. It is well maintained offering small classes in a spacious environment. Facilities include:

- Music, recording and drama studio
- Therapeutic play room
- SES Hub
- Large learning kitchen
- Nurture and induction zones
- IT suite
- Gym and recreational room
- Design and technology workshop
- Science lab
- Mentoring suite
- Vocational skills workshop
- Canteen newsletters and home visits.



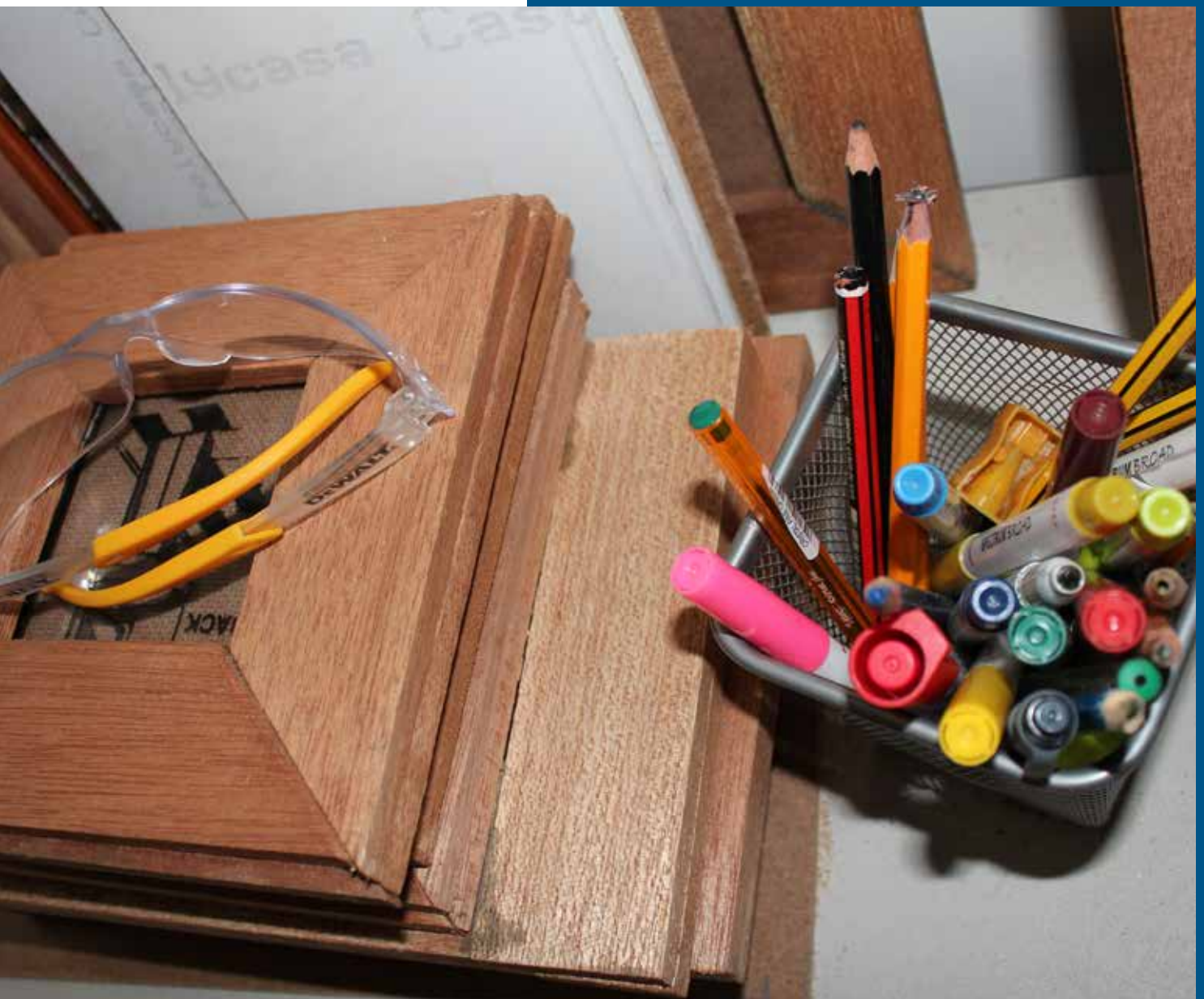
The Staff

The staff team are diverse, creative and nurturing in their approach. They are qualified in a wide range of subjects and all have continuous professional development plans in place. Staff who teach and support students at Leaways have talents, skills and cultural diversity which they bring to the school community and are made up of musicians, a boxer and staff skilled in different languages.

Training

Leaways School is part of Kedleston Group Ltd and as such, is supported by a national and local training programme. The organisation offers both new and existing staff specialist training in addition to the induction and mandatory training which all staff complete. Centralised training includes and is not limited to safeguarding, SEND code of practice, online safety, equality and diversity and data protection.

All professional staff working directly with young people are trained in challenging behaviour, positive behaviour management, and Team-Teach. In addition to this Leaways provide staff with training in Prevent, FGM, Keeping Children Safe in Education, Attachment Disorder, Speech and Language, Occupation Therapy awareness, Autism and Mental Health. The school works in partnership with and accesses training and support from Hackney Learning Trust.





Families

Leaways School has a value based approach to education and works in partnership with families and carers. The school is proud of the strong relationships they have built with families and external stakeholders. Family liaison workers can work directly at home with families to encourage a positive relationship between the family, student and the school. We welcome families who would like to be a part of the Leaways PTA, in particular those for whom, English is a second language. It is important that everyone's voice is heard in the Leaways community.

Governance and Safeguarding

Leaways School London is part of the Kedleston Group which has a governance body consisting of a senior team who oversee, Quality and Compliance, Education, Care, Health, Safety and Estate Management, Human Resources and Training, Financial Management and Strategic Partnerships, The Senior Team are experienced education and care professionals who provide the organisation with the scrutiny and challenge required to ensure that the young people we support are educated and cared for in a safe, supportive and caring environment.

A Safeguarding Overview Committee meets monthly and is chaired by a non-executive Director who reviews all safeguarding across the group. These robust arrangements ensure that lessons learnt and examples of good practice are shared across the group. We continually review our systems in order to strengthen staff awareness and protect the young people in our care.
